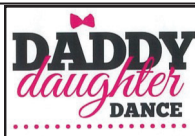

NEW POLICY FOR FAIR VENDORS/FUNDRAISERS

If you are involved with an organization or business that is interested in reserving space at the 2018 Martinsville Agricultural Fair, to be used in conducting a fundraiser, distributing and promoting information, or advertising your business, please contact Norma Calvert at 713-865-0022 for an Application. At the January 2018 Board of Directors Meeting, the Fair Board adopted policies for Fundraisers and General Vendors. Any business or organization (including Not-for-Profit Organizations) selling food will be recognized as a "Food Vendor" and must pay the associated fee. Not-for-Profit groups wishing to conduct a Fundraising Activity that does not involve selling food will be required to pay a \$100 Fee and General Vendors (for purpose of promoting business, causes, political, etc.) will be required to pay \$50 to \$100, depending on the space allocated.) Each applicant will be notified by the Vendor Coordinating Committee of the approval or disapproval of their application and all applicable fees must be paid prior to June 10, 2018.

Damage Prevention

A damaged gas pipeline or service to a house may create an explosion hazard possibly resulting in injury or death, severe property damage and loss of vital service. It you are planning a project that involves digging, trenching, drilling, grading or excavating:

- 1. Call before you dig. 2. Wait the required 48 hours. 3. Respect the marks. 4. Conduct a site survey. 5. Dig with care. 6. If you should happen to expose or damage a gas pipeline or service line, please call City Hall at 217-382-4323. Before you dig call J.U.L.I.E at 811
