CSBG School Supply Program

Embarras River Basin Agency, Inc. (ERBA) is taking applications for the CSBG School Supply Program, which provides required school supplies to eligible children attending kindergarten through 12th grade during the 2018-2019 school year. Those interested should call now for an appointment to apply. **Applications will be taken beginning June 4, 2018.**

This assistance is made possible with funding from the Illinois Department of Commerce & Economic Opportunity (DCEO), Community Services Block Grant Program (CSBG).

Applications will be taken on a first come, first served basis. At the time of application, each applicant will be required to provide proof of all family income for the past 90 days, photo ID for applicant and a social security card for each family member.

Help with Medication cost and Prescription Drug Premiums

The Clark County Life Center will be holding an enrollment Event for Extra Help with Prescription Drugs at the Martinsville Library located at 120 E Cumberland St on Wednesday May 16th at 1:00 – 2:30 downstairs.

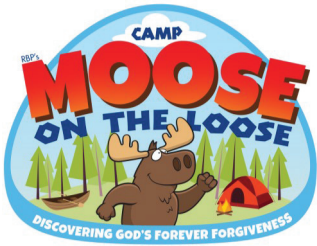
In order to qualify for this program you must have Medicare. There are income and asset limits for this program: Income for 1 person is 1538.00 a month and \$2078.00 a month for a 2 person household. If you have wages only ½ of this income counts. Asset limit 1 person is \$14, 120.00 and for a 2 person household it is 28,150.00. Note your car and your home you live in does not count as an asset. Assets are such as money in bank, 401K, stocks, bonds, or extra land outside of your personal home. If you fall in these guidelines please come to this event and bring your Social Security card. Also know your income and assets or bring these with you. If you have your 1099 from Social Security, this is really helpful.

If you are over in income and do not have very much money in assets please come and I will explain another way to get Extra Help by meeting Medicaid spend-down. If you are interested, we will set up time for a later date to get this processed. I can also answer any other questions you might have at this event.

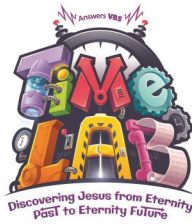

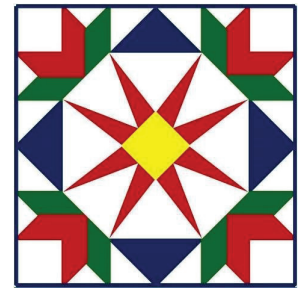
