A damaged gas pipeline or service to a house may create an explosion hazard possibly resulting in injury or death, severe property damage and loss of vital service. If you are planning a project that involves digging, trenching, drilling, grading or excavating:

1. Call before you dig
2. Wait the required 48 hours
3. Respect the marks
4. Conduct a site survey
5. Dig with care
6. If you should happen to expose or damage a gas pipeline or service line please call city hall @ 217-382-432
