#### Carbon Monoxide Awareness

Carbon monoxide is a silent killer. Assure that all fuel burning appliances are installed, maintained and used properly and safely. Those includes having an annual inspection of heating and venting equipment by a "qualified technician" prior to the heating season, and use a required carbon monoxide alarm that meets current standards.

It is important to be aware of the symptoms of CO poisoning. Symptoms can occur immediately or gradually after long term exposure.

#### Common symptoms include:

- Dizziness
- Shortness of Breath
- Headaches
- Confusion
- Nausea
- Fainting

If you have these symptoms after being in an enclosed area, get fresh air immediately and seek medical attention. Be sure to tell them of possible carbon monoxide poisoning. Call a qualified technician to check your fuel burning appliances.

## 2020 Census

A Census is an official count or survey of a population, typically recording various details of individuals. Every ten years a questionnaire is taken that records everyone living at your address on April 1st. This data is then used to inform funding for services including fire stations, schools, clinics, and representation that can affect your community. By April of 2020 you will receive an invite to a simple questionnaire. You can complete the questionnaire online, by phone, or send it by mail. The Clark County Health Department and the Martinsville Public Library District will allow the public access to a computer on site to complete the questionnaire online.
