What have we done to help patrons during this time?

- There are several totes on a bench in front of the library. Check them out for free books, puzzles, magazines and movies. Please do not bring this material back to us! To help prevent the virus these are yours to keep.
- Currently there are only have 3 public computers at this time. In an effort to stay healthy and a safe distance from others, computers are limited. We ask that patrons under the age of 18 not use the computers at this time. There are also 2 tablets available for use as well.
 - Removed toys from the children's area to prevent the spread of germs
- Chairs have been removed from several locations to make sure that every patron is a safe distance from others for their safety.
 - The library won't be hosting any indoor programming in the near future.
 - The meeting room is not currently available to borrow for meetings.
 - There is a contact prevention device on the circulation counter.
 - All material returned to the library should be placed in the basket on the counter.
- All items will be quarantined for 3 days. This means that you may receive a notification that your material is overdue. You may also notice the material is still on your account if you access it online. We can assure you that you will not be charged a fine for this. Until the item is checked in it the librarian cannot adjust this. Once it is checked in the librarian will make sure you are not charged for the 3 days that it was in quarantine .
 - After quarantine items are then cleaned with disinfectant before being place back on the shelf.
 - The counter is wiped down with bleach wipes throughout the day.
 - Water fountains and the keurig are currently unavailable for patron use.

A PARK FOR ALL AGES – FUN FOR ADULTS AS WELL AS CHILDREN

Martinsville on the Move is undertaking a new project...a new park to provide everyone of all ages a place to exercise, enjoy nature and have a unique park experience. Approximately five acres of land for the new park is being donated by the Littlejohns and is located on the south side of Cumberland, across from the Library and Littlejohn Grain parking areas. The area extends south to the Rail Road right-of-way and the southern portion spans east to Iris Lane.

Development of the park will be coordinated by Martinsville on the Move and subsequently gifted to the City. The goal is to create a one-of-a-kind park to encourage family interaction with fun activities year-around. The park will tie into the National Road Trail, being planned to intersect Clark County, leading to tourism and increased traffic for our local businesses.

The acreage on top of the hill is primarily flat, cleared land. Extensive work has already been completed to clear off more brush, with plans for a surfaced walking path on the higher ground and natural trails along the hill sides.

Some of the ideas currently being considered for developing the park include: Exercise Equipment for Adults placed at intervals around the path; Outdoor Musical Instruments; a Zip Line; a Hillside Slide; a cleared hill for winter sledding; a Spiderweb Climber; a Disc Golf Course; benches, parking, etc. The ideas are limitless. The goals are ambitious to develop this unique park, requiring it to be completed in phases.

Upon finalization of the survey, Phase 1 will begin and is expected to be completed this summer. It will focus on additional clearing and development of the walking paths, building of a parking area and installation of benches along the path. Phase 2 will include installation of the exercise equipment, musical instruments, hill-side slide, zip line, etc. Phase 3 will include the finishing touches such as picnic tables, a shelter, flowering shrubs/trees, etc.

There are many jobs in developing the park that can be completed by volunteers. Work days will be planned and announced on FaceBook to help make this project a reality. "Like" Martinsville on the Move on Facebook to keep up with the progress and watch for ways you and your family or organization can be a part of this community project.
